Death records are available from 1905–present. Certificates may be ordered online at vitalrecords.utah.gov, by mail, or in person. It is a criminal offense (26B-8-133) to make false statements on this application or to fraudulently obtain a vital records certificate. All fees paid are non-refundable. If required information is missing from this application, applicant will have 90 days to provide missing information before the fee paid will expire.

Please provide the requested information in the form below so DHHS Vital Records can process your request. The information you give us will only be used by DHHS to process your request, and if necessary, may be accessed by contractors who are a part of the DHHS technical team. We will not be able to process your request without the requested information. This data is part of the record series 81448.

Acceptable identification to obtain vital records

Identification (ID) must be current

Identification is required for all non-public vital records. Mailed requests must include an easily identifiable photocopy of the front and back of the identification from the list below or the application will be returned. One form of identification from the “Primary” column is required **or** two forms of identification from the “Secondary” column.

Primary

(Need 1 – photo ID)

- Government issued photo identification
- Employment authorization card
- U.S. military identification card
- Tribal identification card
- Permanent resident card
- Foreign visa
- U.S. passport
- U.S. passport card
- Foreign passport
- U.S. naturalization certificate or certificate of citizenship
- Matricula consular card
- Concealed weapon permit

- Veteran’s health ID card

Secondary

(Need 2)

- Work identification - paycheck stub or W-2
- School, university or college ID card
- Voter registration card

- Marriage license (certified copy with signatures, not an abstract)
- Court order or court documents
- Jail/prison documents
- Probation documents

We cannot accept:

- Novelty Identification Card (ID not issued by the government)
- Driving Privilege Card (prohibited by law UCA 53-3-207(7)(b)(ii)).

If you do not have acceptable identification, you can ask your spouse, parent, grandparent, sibling, or adult child to show their appropriate identification to request the certificate. You may be asked to show proof that you are related.
